
- a) The Damages Petrel.)- Not indigenous to the south, a migrant bird from the far north. Often leaves its matexx to look after the nest for long periods. Open season is any time of the year.
- b) Seldom-spotted chippy bird. Spends much of its time on the nest, but has been seen in boggy regions. It warbles continually. This species is nearing extinction (but not near enough).
- c) Flick Fartridge. Mainly a sea bird. Normally visits land for breeding purposes only. Suspected of being a sheep worrier.

 Considered by many to be a pest and may be shot on sight.
- d) The Bee-el bird. One of the larger anturatic species. Easily attracted by whistlers. 


SHORTLY AFTER THE NEW TERMINOLOGY WAS ANOUNCED, A PRELIMINARY


